

# Single site funding support for COVID-19 impacted areas in the Australian Capital Territory and Victoria extended

## Australian Capital Territory

Following the extended [hotspot declaration](#) in the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) by the Australian Government Chief Medical Officer, Professor Paul Kelly, workers at residential aged care facilities in impacted areas are asked to limit their work to a single facility to reduce the risk of transmission and protect workers and residents.

Australian Government grant funding is available to support implementation of these arrangements in the ACT from **12 August to 2 September 2021**. Single site arrangements should remain in place throughout this period.

## Victoria

Following the [extended hotspot declaration](#) in Victoria by the Australian Government Chief Medical Officer, Professor Paul Kelly, workers at residential aged care facilities in impacted areas are asked to limit their work to a single facility to reduce the risk of transmission and protect workers and residents.

Australian Government grant funding is available to support implementation of these arrangements in Greater Melbourne, City of Greater Geelong, Moorabool Shire and Golden Plains Shire for an extended period until **2 September 2021**. Single site arrangements should remain in place throughout this period.

A reminder that providers should continue to ensure workers are not financially disadvantaged by maintaining their average take home pay in their regular pay cycle.
